June 2026 Debt/Bank Loan for Worship Center, Music Center and Kid City



Originally the Loan was \$1,829,853.44 in November 2016
The Loan is now \$278,748.00 as of April 21, 2024.

FBC Endowment, a support organization of First Baptist Church of Tempe, services the National Bank of Arizona loan out of \$13,500.00 monthly payment from the church. With an additional \$24,000.00 of contributions each year, that loan would be fully paid off in May 2026. (And by the end of that year, a secondary loan of \$110,000.00 would also be paid off.) Payments of \$13,500 per month (\$162,000.00) can then be used to support other ministries of the church!



April 2024 God Stories

“Trust in Him at all times, O people;

- 1. Pray, Pour Out Your Heart, and Trust God.** After much prayer and consideration, the FBCT Deacon Board unanimously recommends Pastor John Heston to the FBCT family as a candidate for the Senior Pastor position. They ask that you continue to join them in prayer as on Sunday, April 14, 2024 a vote will be held in each worship service to determine if Pastor Heston will be the next Senior Pastor for FBCT. Pray for our FBC Family that we would pray and then trust God’s leading.
- 2. Trusting God to Use You to Build His Kingdom.** Damaris Beltran spent her spring break in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico building a roof, painting walls, apply stucco, mixing cement, spooling wire, and shoveling dirt. She did this to show God’s love to the poor. Damaris says, “But it is much more than that. This is an opportunity to share Jesus. I am fluent in Spanish. I have a unique opportunity to talk to people and share my faith, and not just do the physical labor. I am only 15 years old, and although I don't have all the answers or know the Bible as well as I should, I can still plant seeds. I plant seeds by sharing what I do know, I plant seeds by loving people, showing kindness, playing with the little kids, and developing relationships with the families we are helping. My favorite part is always connecting with people, talking to them and sharing my life with them. I plan on continuing these trips as long as God allows me to!” Pray that God uses these mission trips in Damaris’ life to not only change the lives in Mexico but also to change her life. Great job, Damaris!

3. Church Planters Pray, Pour Out Their Hearts and Trust God!

Pastor Peter and Trish Molina, FBCT's church planters are seeing fruit from their ministry. Pastor Peter writes, "Months ago, I shared a story about one young adult named Antonio. He was seeking help from witchcraft books at the Guadalupe library to "cast spells" on his own family. A couple of weeks ago, by God's grace, I led him through the sinner's prayer. Now, he is hungry for God's Word and growth. Antonio's decision to accept Christ's free gift of forgiveness was made after many conversations. Each Friday I asked him how he was doing and he was an open book ready for someone to dive in and help him peel back parts of his story like an onion while moving forward as he figures out how to turn the next page." Pray and trust God with the Molina's.

4. Women's Retreat Will Prepare You to Trust a Sovereign God.

"Life is Like a Box of Chocolates" – you don't know what you will get. This weekend without responsibility is filled with lots of laughter, freedom to be silly and the assurance of being accepted. It's listening, sharing, and praying. It's building new friendships and rekindling the old. Most importantly it's growing in your personal relationship with Jesus. It's Women's Retreat! 5. Praise God! People Want to Trust God Together at FBCT!

That is right. It is exciting to see the increased interest in belonging to a family of like-minded believers. When you belong to FBC-T, you are saying that you are committed to worshipping, serving and encouraging the family here. You, too, can join FBC-T. You, too, can serve the family and trust God together. Our pastors would be glad to help you through the steps to membership.

6. **Committed to Truth and Trusting God.** The 6:15am Men's Monday morning group taught by Greg Jones is doing an in-depth study called "The Truth Project." Praise God for this faithful group of men who welcomes any new man, who studies meticulously, who shows up faithfully and who are all committed to living a life for Jesus by trusting Him and by defending the Gospel.

7. **The More You Understand – The More You Trust.** One person gave this feedback after attending the "How to Read/Apply the Bible" special Sunday Bible class: "I have benefited greatly from the new class. I am learning homiletics." Austin Erwin has enjoyed teaching this material at FBC on Sunday mornings. Praise God for Austin. One day I really wanted to leave so I went into my bedroom, dropped to my knees and really talked and prayed to the Lord to please help me escape my situation. The next morning, I received a phone call to say he was incarcerated.

13. **Celebrating with Graduates.** FBCT has the privilege of hosting the 2024 Phoenix Seminary graduation May 4th. They will be using our worship center for their graduation ceremony. FBCT’s Mindelle Will and Alicia Padilla will both receive their master’s degrees that day. Congratulations, Mindelle and Alicia!

Charitable Donations from IRA's

If you are over 70½ and have assets held in an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) the following information regarding Required Minimum Distributions (hereafter noted simply as RMD) may be very pertinent to you. This information was taken from various sources believed to be reliable:

There are some extra tax benefits to transferring your RMD to the charity, rather than withdrawing your RMD and then donating to a charity. As with any financial subject, the government could change the rules, so it is always best to check with your accountant or tax advisor before proceeding.

How much can I transfer from my IRA to charity? Can I transfer more than my RMD?

Yes, if you are 70½ or older, you can transfer up to \$100,000 to charity tax-free each year -- even if that's more than your RMD. The money counts as your RMD but isn't included in your adjusted gross income.

I'll be 70½ in a few months. Can I give my RMD to charity now?

No--you have to wait until you are at least one day over 70½ years of age to make the tax-free transfer to charity.

Can I give do this with my 401(k) funds as well?

No. You can only make the tax-free transfer from an IRA. Therefore, you cannot make such a tax-free distribution from a 401(k), 401(b), 401(a), or any other ERISA account.

Can I withdraw the money from my IRA and then write a check to charity, or do I need to transfer the money directly?

The rules are very strict in this regard. You must have the custodian of your IRA transfer the money directly from your IRA to the non-profit for it to count as the tax-free transfer.

Each custodian has slightly different procedures on how they do this but the funds must go directly out of the IRA and directly to the charity.

It is extremely important that you notify the non-profit that you are donating to them so that they will know 'who' the donor is! It also helps to provide the non-profit's ID number, exact mailing address, phone number, and a person that the mail is to be directed to. For example, in the case of a donation to First Baptist Church of Tempe, you would tell the custodian of your IRA the following information:

If you have check-writing privileges for your IRA, you can write a check to the charity but be sure to alert the charity so it knows the contribution came from you!

So which is better: the tax-free transfer or the charitable deduction?

If you do not itemize, then the tax-free transfer is nearly always more advantageous to the donor. Just remember to alert your tax preparer as the custodian of your IRA will still issue a 1099R. You need to show the tax preparer the donation-letter you received from the non-profit to prove that the charity received the funds.
