





Candle Three Equals the ShepherdsThird Week of Advent) Luke 2:8-18 and John 10:14-15

God could have chosen any number of people to be the recipients of the announcement that His Son had

been born. But He did not choose the educated religious leaders of that day, or a government official ... instead, He chose an ordinary group of people: shepherds. Shepherds were in a lower class of Jewish society and how appropriate it was that God selected them. It was in keeping with His philosophy of "looking on the heart" (I Samuel 16:7) instead of the outward appearance or social standing. When God chose shepherds, He was telling us that His love, demonstrated in the arrival of His Son, was for ALL people.

Shepherds performed the menial tasks required to maintain the health and safety of their flocks. Their humble hearts were ready for the announcement of Christ's coming. They believed the message of the angels and immediately put their faith into action. They left their usual business to seek the true Shepherd.

At the beginning of each day, we need to make a choice to humble our hearts and submit to God's direction. Take a moment to ask Jesus if there is something specific He wants you to do this week.




Candy Cane

Stripes that are red like the blood shed for me!
