Missionaries Ryan, Shelby and kids say "Thank you" from Papua New Guinea to many of you who prayed for them and or gave money and donations to help them return to church plant among the Manam people. Your prayers and monthly financial support are deeply needed and appreciated. But it is enough Jesus died for me.

2. Thank you, Lord, for the following people in the last couple weeks who signed up to serve Jesus in the choir or orchestra or the sound booth: Damon, Aly, Jessie, Karen, Lonnie, Kathleen, Sherise, Tom and Miranda. Plus, more people are considering. We need you in the choir. Join us. I need no other argument that Jesus died for me.

3. I followed my Dad in drinking alcohol and for 18 years I was a drunk. I hurt many people. I was so wrong. Now for the last 15 years I have been clean, sober and I stopped drinking completely, 100% no more, because the Lord changed my life. I now tell people follow Jesus and say no to drinking, alcohol and drugs.

4. Recently in church during the worship song at 11:00 am as we sang, "See the Lost He is Saving," I looked to my right about 30 yards and a young single man was standing alone and crying. Repeatedly he wiped tears from his eyes. Was God at work in his heart? Yes, I think so. The next song we sang was, "God Heard Humanity Cry." Can you see God at work?

5. Neir is a young Asian adult female, first time guest, who recently came to Sunday Night Worship. Before church started I introduced myself. After church I thanked her for attending and she said, "I am so glad I came tonight. I needed to hear the message on loving people with no biases and no prejudice. Thank you."

6. It started out as a normal Wednesday morning on July 6 as Mark rode his bicycle to a nearby Circle-K. On the return trip home Mark was clearly in a cross walk when a driver in a car hit Mark broadside flipping him on top of the hood of the car and sent him crashing into the windshield with his bike under the car. Mark received a broken hip. Broken ribs. Broken shoulder. Broken right ankle. A concussion. Pray for Mark as he recovers and by the grace of God is in stable condition. If you can help Mark with some cash for his many bills, please donate online or give a check to FBCT earmarked Mark or bicycle accident. We thank God Mark's life was preserved.

7. Lonnie came to worship most recently for the first time. I asked how did you find our church? Lonnie said, "God made me see this church as I drove by." I said, "God loves to speak to us through our eyes, ears, heart and mind and His Spirit works on our souls. Lonnie smiled big and said "Yes."

8. Are you learning to discern God's whispers over the enemy's shouts? One person humbly said, "This means that I have to watch who has my ear." We are warned against having "itching ears," which is just listening to what makes us feel good. I used to listen to mediums and psychics and got caught up in what might be my future and what path to take. But be careful who has your ear! With social media, fake news, false prophets, and peer pressure - too many people are speaking. You must train your ear to hear God through His Word and prayer and he will confirm and speak to you with peace and clarity when you ask. "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realm." (Ephesians 6:12)

9. "Hi this is Tom calling and if you just want to text back that "Yes" you're praying that would be fine. We had an MRI with my wife and just found out there is a tumor on her brain. This is horrible. I'm trying not to overthink this but this doesn't look good so just please keep us in your prayers. I would rather stay ignorant as to what's going on because I really have no idea but we will be seeing a doctor soon. I just wanted to call and let you know." I returned the call to Tom and listened, listened, encouraged, pointed to Romans 8:28 and prayed. My heart feels Tom's pain and stress.

10. A couple of weeks ago Mom and I both got Covid at the same time. I was already feeling strangled and alone in my role as family caregiver. When we got sick all of the other caregivers that help mom around the clock had to be called off. I moved in with mom by myself for five days, five nights. 24/7. It was an extremely mentally and emotionally challenging time for me. I missed my home, my husband, my family and my "freedom." The only place I could turn was UP. I began reading Joyce Meyers book on "7 Things That Steal Your Joy". Also, the book "Trusting God" by Jerry Bridges. Both of these books citing many scripture verses about the Sovereignty of God.

11. I want to start by mentioning that fear has ruled my life. One bad thought and I was completely hindered. It seemed SO hard for me to gain control over my mind. I was a highly competitive gymnast and this kind of mindset was crippling and extremely difficult to overcome. It bled into every area of my life. I think I was seeking some sort of foundation and truth to anchor and train my mind in. Here are some of my favorite truths: God's Word does not change. God is a good father. He wants me close. He likes hearing from me and enjoys me. He gives good gifts. He provides for me and will not leave me. He directs my path. He works all things for my good. He is more concerned with my character than my comfort.

12. After two years of complete absence from church, because of Covid, God clearly told me I needed to return to on-campus, in person worship. I had a problem. In the last two years I became independent of God. I was not depending on God but on self. With tears he said, "I am learning to trust God again and love the family of God."

13. With big tears and much anxiety, the teen said, "Mom I saw this religious video on social media and the teacher said the Bible says, 'Soon bad angels under the Euphrates river, when it dries up, will come out of the ground to kill many people and nobody is talking about it. Is that true?'" I told this parent, "Revelation 9:13 -21 says in the future, NOT now, yes this will occur. But no one knows when this will occur. John who wrote the Book of Revelation expected this to occur in his life time, 2000 years ago. For many generations people expected it to happen in their life time. Yes, it will happen in the future. No one knows when." Never tell people what only God knows and controls. Jesus said, "No one knows the timing of the future except God."

14. Pray for me he said, "I just demolished my car, I totaled it. I'm not doing well, several injuries and lots of pain. I became dizzy, while driving my car, from prescription medicine and messed up my turn. Pray for me." I said, "I am praying, so glad you are still alive. You have a long road to recovery. How can I help?" He said, "Just pray". (A few basic lessons: Read the side effects on all prescription medication. Triple check your driving skills even under normal conditions. God says, ask for help. Let others protect you. Protect one another.)

15. "Which job does God want me to take?" he asked. "The one that pays the most money but requires a major relocation for our family to the East Coast? Or the job which pays a little less, no relocating and we remain near our family and relatives which we love dearly?" I replied, "The better paying job gives you more money but you will be far away from family with major expenses to visit your family. I don't know what God wants for you but trading a little extra money for a far-away move away from family requires a major evaluation and much prayer. Be careful, money will not buy happiness. If all the factors are basically equal, a few more dollars will not replace a long-distance relationship with family and relative. 16. A neighbor took his family to a lake which ended in disaster. Pray. While enjoying a ride on a pontoon boat, his daughter and friend fell off the boat and were hit by the propeller. Numerous cuts down to the bone and much blood loss. They are now in the hospital with many surgeries, both are expected to live. The family is emotionally distraught. Pray for healing. God is using me to help them.

17. Are you discouraged by the suffering and confusion of life? Raise your eyes and soften your heart to God. Never forget this amazing promise to God's people true believers from Joel 2:25. God says, "Then I will compensate you for the years, That the swarming locust has eaten, The creeping locust, the stripping locust, and the gnawing locust" — Locust is symbolic for pain and suffering. This means your future, as a Believer in Jesus, is filled with good, compensation and blessings from God even though disappointment and misery surround you. Bet the farm on God. Trust the promises of God at all times.

18. One church leader writes, "I pray I can have the opportunity to be of service to God. I am learning it is much better to listen more, ask permission to ask questions and to summarize what you hear. This has greatly improved my understanding of many situations. God is growing me and using me to help rebuild a broken marriage of 42 years. Praise God as He is showing me how to better love difficult people and teaching me to be more thankful for everything in my life.

19. Life is filled with painful "related" challenges. On the same day my friend quit his job, strangely enough, the bank called his employer to confirm his employment on a recent loan on a new truck. But since he was unemployed the bank repossessed his truck and all the work tools in it. The bank has no mercy. Pray for much needed discernment for my friend to see the "law of cause and effect." Every careless action we take will often have reactions with painful implications. This ripple effect is by design. Everything in life is designed to be a growth opportunity to help us act and think more like Jesus.

20. One person said to me, "I started thinking how the social media culture glorifies wealth and laziness. But the Bible says we need to work hard and not be lazy." I replied, "If we do not honor God and work hard we will self-destruct. There are lots of examples in the Bible. If we fear man more than God than we make people bigger than God. The Bible calls all of this idolatry. Love God with everything. Live and work all for God. No self-glory. Everything is a gift from God." The idolatry you run to today will be your misery tomorrow.
