



Managing Loss and Grief Top Five Inner-Heartbreaks of Life by Teresa Kovac

- Loss of desire to go on: apathy and depression (e.g., food not tasting as good, company not enjoyable, alone-time painful too etc., colors seem dimmed, lack of desire and goals and/or the lack of energy to seek those desires and goals). Can be complicated by imagined and real guilt.
- 2. **An adverse condition**: temporary memory or mental function loss, chest pain, many other symptoms can express. Associated with but not limited to shut down or suppression of the loss of desire to go on.
- 3. **Unwanted** world change: requires adjustments that seem unattractive and less than what was before.
- 4. **Testing of faith** as death separates us from sensing God, especially if we have focused on being blessed and only know a God of blessing.
- 5. A longing for what is lost, e.g., coping, defense mechanisms and/or things that made life good: desire to return to the state of before the pain, trauma, loss, shame and guilt, to dwell in past, or avoid dealing with the past.

The following core truths need to be reviewed as needed for each.

1. **Grieve with hope.** Grieve (John 11:35), only with hope (1 Thessalonians 4:13)

When you feel the loss of desire to go on: On the one hand, you can't skip grief just because you have hope (Job 13:15, Psalm 42, Psalm 23:4, Psalm 61:2b). God expects us to honestly lament (Lamentations 3, Psalm 22); tears are healthy (John 11:35, Psalm 80:5, Psalm 126:5). Loss causes a wound; healing is a process so expect a season of grief (Ecclesiastes 3:4-5, Psalm 30) and expect that God, not we, determines how long the season is. While we can't set a deadline, we can do healthy things that shorten the time required. Knowing of hope is not internalizing to all our biological systems (it is like needing to clear the caches); nor is it all that is involved in obeying the steps to joy (see below). If there is sin, it must be repented and forgiven (James 5:16).

On the other hand, without hope it is difficult to mature grief into joy. Jesus is the source of hope, our salvation (Romans 15:13, Psalm 119:14, 1 Timothy 1:1). Toward salvation: Romans 3:23, Romans 6:23, John 3:3, John 14:6, Romans 10:9-11, 2 Corinthians 5:15, Revelation 3:20.

2. Practical care is needed while in the shadow of death. (Luke 21:34)

When you face adverse conditions think "DEER." "DEER" = drink water, eat, exercise, rest. This requires us to be patient in healing as we would be from a physical wound, wait while taking care. God is still there, there are just dark clouds obscuring Him. Joy is still possible, there are just dark clouds hiding the path to joy. (Psalm 23:4 key word is through, Luke 21:34, 1 Corinthians 3:16-17 (body a temple), 2 Corinthians 3:16-17 (removing veil), 1 Timothy 4:7-8 (requires our discipline).

3. God is in control. (Isaiah 45:6-7)

When an unwanted world change occurs – think daily: God, who is good and righteous and just, is in control (James 1:13, Deuteronomy 32:4, 10-11, Psalm 145: all but especially verse 13-14, Ezra 9:15, Psalm 50:6, Psalm 116:5). No matter how awful it looks now (Psalm 34:19), the end God will bring about is good and beautiful and right (Revelation 21:4, Deuteronomy 32:39). We can rest in His providence as we adjust to new circumstances (Psalm 46:1), that there is a path forward (Philippians 4:13, Proverbs 3:5), a way of escape from the misery (Job 1:22, 1 Corinthians 10:13, Psalm 3, Psalm 27).

- 4. Every earthly relationship is a temporary gift from God, but one with repercussions for the eternal age to come. (Ephesians 1-2:10)
- When you expect prosperity without trial, change your thinking: God determined our number of days from before the foundation of the world. (Psalm 139:16b, Psalm 39, Psalm 24, Matthew 13:35, Ephesians 1:1, 3-6, 2:10, Acts 15:18). Our loved ones also had a number of days set by God (Psalm 90:3-5), and our time with them was His gift. (James 1:17, Psalm 90:5b-6, 10-12). We never owned them (Job 1:21) we never had a right to them (1 Corinthians 4:7). God wouldn't leave us here without having a use for us without our loved ones (Psalm 90:15-17, Hebrews 13:16).
- **5. Seek comfort in Scripture, Prayer and Service. (James 5:13-17)** When you have a loved one who dies in a difficult circumstance: remember, our loved ones who passed away only want good for us in difficult circumstances: even if they were flawed here (Luke 16). God wants only good for us (John 10:10, Jeremiah 29:11, Psalm 34:18), even if awful

things happen now (1 Samuel 2:6-7). If we have forgiven, we want good for

others, even when we sometimes observe ourselves failing at providing it (1 John 2:6). If we have not forgiven, we need to recognize the gap in our obedience, and that we are poisoning ourselves and expecting others to suffer (Matthew 6:14, Matthew 18:21-22, Matthew 10:8). God always left us free choice (Revelation 3:20), but he is also powerful and has a mighty desire to save (Zephaniah 3:17); we never know the status of our loved ones only He does (Romans 11:29, Deuteronomy 29:29a).

When you long for the good times of the past: If suffering, pray (Psalm 130:5), including with others (James 5:13). Read and meditate on scripture (Hebrews 4:12). Then do and serve (Ephesians 2:10): We are not meant as containers to be filled with comfort, but as conduits of comfort: helping others helps us (1 Peter 2:9). If we hope on the Lord, we can trust that we will soar again (Isaiah 40:31).

God Stories - February 2023

- 1. Good friends of FBC have an estranged son that they have not heard from in quite a while. He was living out of state, but a couple of weeks ago he showed up at an AZ Motor Vehicle Department that just happened to have one of our FBC members working at. She was able to connect with him and relay back to his mom and dad that he is living back in AZ and physically ok. Praising God for providing them with reassurance!
- 2. He started coming to the 6:00 pm service during the summer. Looking to reconnect with God amidst debilitating depression coming from various other personal issues, he found what he was looking for a willing ear to listen to his story. After telling his story to an FBC pastor that night, he started attending a morning service and Sunday school. As he became closer to God, he also felt even more attacks from the enemy. Through the various ministries of FBC as well as council from a Christian friend, he is now doing much better. The depression comes and goes but he now has a firm foundation in Jesus. For 2023, his goal is "to help people in the same way this church helped me."
- 3. He started attending the 6:00 pm service and was so thankful that FBC offered a night service that worked with his work schedule. When the school year came, he brought his son to attend Awana while he worshipped. During the fall God put it on his heart that he needed a career change he felt he wasn't moving forward in life and becoming stagnant. It was scary. God was calling him to leave the only profession he had known and a place of employment that he had comfortably worked at for many years. What was even scarier was that God was calling him into a line of work that he knew nothing about and was blindly jumping into. With counsel from an FBC pastor, he decided to go in for an interview. In the interview he told the interviewer that he was a Christian and they said that they appreciated that. He got a call right away that they wanted him for the job. After leaving his old job and a week of training for the new job, he is enjoying himself immensely and thanks God for pushing him in this new, exciting direction.
- 4. Our FBC children collected \$600.00 to help send our Missionaries Ryan & Shelby Webb and family, back to Papua New Guinea, an island north of Australia.
- 5. Kid City has 48 dedicated leaders who are doing Kingdom work every Sunday.

- 6. This year my wife and I have been working with a single mom (young adult). She would come to church without a Bible. My wife gifted her one and since then she's been coming to church with that Bible and has read through Genesis. We have befriended her and our children have become close friends. We've also been of assistance in her struggles as a single mother. God has blessed us and her with friendship and we've been able to disciple her. FBC has also blessed her family she told us she was able to provide for her children during Christmas.
- 7. This year the church plant has hosted and conducted a series of Bible studies and social gatherings (fellowship activities). Through these studies and gatherings, we have established multiple friendships and helped people in their walk with God. Even those who didn't know God are starting to seek Him. Two people were able to be baptized and others are diving deeper into the Bible. Throughout this experience of hosting and teaching the studies, my son has opened his heart and mind to the will and way of God and is wanting to do kids Bible studies. These Bible studies have become an impact on adults as well as children who attend, as both adults and children are wanting more Bible studies and or gatherings.
- 8. Back in August, a teenager, resident of the Town of Guadalupe, was gunned down. He was a student at Marcos de Niza High School. The friends and family of the teen had set-up a memorial near the site where the boy was killed. Trish and I felt the need to go to that memorial and offer prayer. Trish put material together, including Bibles to hand out. Myself and another went and spoke to a family and prayed over them. The family we spoke to knew the boy personally and were very grateful we were there. They were comforted in their moment of grief.
- 9. Earlier this year the church plant hosted an outdoor Easter service. Through this event at Kiwanis Park we were able to share our testimonies at the end of the service with a homeless person who ended up receiving Christ. We also met two families who we invited to our Bible studies. They showed up, and one family has remained with us. It was also great to see the volunteers who attend the church plant Bible studies engage in acts of service and sharing Christ with strangers at the Easter service.
- 10. During 2022 it has been such a huge blessing to see people give to the church plant. It is heartwarming to hear testimonies from donors of why they feel called to donate. Their feelings line up to why my wife and I said "Yes" to church planting in the first place. It is amazing to see people from

all walks of life coming together to give for the expansion of the Kingdom. Every gift is a miracle that only God can orchestrate.

- 11. The youth were previously on a waitlist for Summer Camp in Glorieta, New Mexico, but were recently able to fully lock in spots due to a policy change that allowed for more students. This is one of the premier camps in the southwest, and a favorite of our students!
- 12. We received a ton of positive feedback on the Christmas Eve services. People enjoyed the special food, the wide range of music from traditional to contemporary, the unique and fun preaching, the worship center décor, and the gifts for children.



- 13. We had a large number of volunteers dedicate hours and hours to band rehearsals, food preparation and service, cleanup, candles, tech, and many more positions to make Christmas Eve a success. FBC and visitors were blessed tremendously by their service to Jesus.
- 14. Our youth group has been excited about the possibility of doing more short-term mission work, and have been requesting to go on a trip soon. There are three potential trips in the works, which may start to come to fruition in 2023.
- 15. Can you see God at work? One person writes, "It was interesting to note that when I did the self-assessments within The Dark Side of Leadership that I have a dominant characteristic of being Codependent. I suspect that is not uncommon being an adult child of a violent alcoholic (and I was the scapegoat of the family). It was interesting when I recently read the book Adult Children of Alcoholics to find just how accurately it defined the relationships that merge in that environment. It's also been interesting for me to identify how the personality traits that have resulted my being successful are, in many ways, also my weaknesses. Looking back, the Lord blessed me by exposing me to His redemptive grace through the Youth Ministry and fellowship at FBCT. That's why I stated that FBCT is my happy place last Sunday. But it's more than the memories of FBCT, and more about spending time praying and contemplating the things of the Spirit. I think the two go hand-in-hand and when I neglect the Spiritual side of my life, I drift towards my own dark side."
- 16. Reverence for God leads to peace. People need the Lord. One person said, "It is strange that California has the most rigid gun laws in the nation yet they have many mass shootings and killings and this happens and happens and happens. Gun policy experts said that a national culture that accepts routine violence, combined with an inability to enforce gun

controls in one state that is surrounded by others where rules are more lax means that California will continue to grapple with public mass violence. Pray for California (and your neighborhood) as it ACCEPTS ROUTINE VIOLENCE-yes-that is a cultural problem-and if there were no guns in the USA these angry people would use knives, bombs, fire, flame throwers etc. So, the weapon isn't the problem-it is the lack of self-control and the glorification in movies and 'games' and 'video games' and the newspapers and reporters saying 'get angry-you should feel that it is the other's guy fault ALL the time ... get even ... it is THAT CULTURE that creates this problem."

- 17. Exciting to watch God bless. Two kids, missionary children, are raising money so they can return to FBCT in the next two months to spend a couple months with their youth group, friends and Grand-parents. Pray for Avery and Rylynn, children of Ryan and Shelby Webb who are full-time missionaries in Papua, New Guinee to the Manam people. The FBCT Teenagers are also raising money to help them return to FBCT soon.
- 18. We thank God for this FBCT teenager. Hello, my name is Grace Blum. I am going with Valley Christian to Turkana, Kenya. This is an amazing opportunity to serve God by ministering to Kenyan children. While at Valley I have been able to sing in the choir and I have been cheering on the school's cheer team for four years. This engage trip is an exciting opportunity to represent Christ, my school and minister to children in a place I have wanted to visit since I was young. I love serving other people in any way I can, so I am really looking forward to meeting and serving the people of Kenya. Thank you for considering to help me reach my goal of ministering in Kenya. You can support this ministry by donating and/ or praying for me as I prepare for this life-changing experience. Thank you for taking the time to read this and for your prayers and support.
- 19. God at work. On Friday, January 27-29, our $4^{th}-6^{th}$ grade children pack-up and climb on a bus to head to Winter Camp to encounter God and have some fun.
